PHEASANTS

ARCHERY

For the most part, archery is at rest for the summer. The out-

door walk around range is up and running. <u>Please</u> no broad heads in these targets. Please note: during the weeks from July 9 through July 19 the summer archery class will be out at the club grounds on Mondays through Thursdays from 8 a.m. to noon. The rifle range will be closed during these times. Remember the 3-D Shoot on August 18-19.

SHOOTING

The summer shooting season is upon us. Trap shooting has started (Good luck to the Rod and Gun team that finished #1 last year.) The first steel match was held on April 22. There were 24 shooters in that match. There are five stages and four classes represented in match. Top score for the day went to a shooter in the young class. Seeing the "younguns" besting us old timers brings out some mixed emotions, but it is great to see young shooters actively participating in the shooting sports. There will be some "tweaking" of the event in the future to see if we can get things to roll along at a smoother pace. The next match is scheduled for May 20 from noon to 4 p.m. If you wish to participate, please try to be there as close to noon as possible. There will be no new registrations after 3 p.m. Bring as many magazines as you can, as this will speed up the process. There are five reloads at each stage, and a minimum of 170 rounds will be needed if you have no misses. It is best to have 200 rounds to be sure. Please note that the rifle range will be closed for this event. Times for the matches

will be: Sunday, May 20— Noon to 4 p.m. June 10—Noon to 4 p.m. July 15—Noon to 4 p.m.

The Ruger State Match is tentatively set for Saturday, August The Indianhead Pistol League banquet and awards night will be Friday, May 4 at 6 p.m. It is "pot luck" so bring a dish to pass. Supper will be served at 7 p.m. with awards following. This is the last event for the season, but there will be some practice sessions during the summer. Check the calendar on the bulletin board for dates. The times will usually be 10 a.m. to noon.
