HISTORY

December 7, 1941, at about 8:00 a.m., the world was changed drastically. Japanese aircraft (353) swept into Pearl Harbor bombing and torpedo-

ing the fleet of 150 US Navy ships in the harbor. On that day 2403 Americans Died. 1177 of those were on the battleship USS Arizona. On December 8, 1941, the USA was officially in WWII. **Today** the Arizona remains are a memorial to those who died. If you have the opportunity to visit this sight, don't miss it. This place is visited by millions of people every year. As President Franklin D. Roosevelt stated, "December 7, 1941 is a date which will live in infamy."

TRAVEL
